Call attracts almost 100 bids

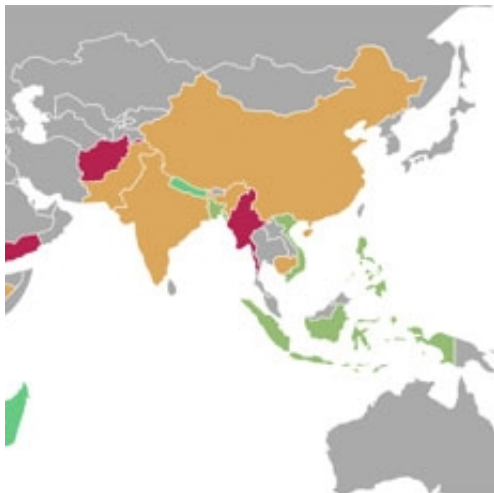
LANSA's Call for Research Proposals, announced in May, has attracted 94 bids. The bids received cover Afghanistan (1), Bangladesh (18), India (26) and Pakistan (31).
